Entry regulations:

- Entries are accepted on a “first received” basis on or after the opening date and time. These trials accept paper and **Labtestedonline** online entries (see Entry Fees below Classes Offered, this page).
- Paper entries received within 24 hours of the opening date and time must (1) have postage or be metered and (2) be delivered by a multi-state or multi-national postal or carrier service, including but not limited to USPS, FedEx, UPS & DHL. If the above conditions are not met, the entries are not valid and must be returned to the sender.
- A maximum of 10 entries per envelope is allowed. Envelopes with more than 10 entries and/or entries received prior to the opening date will be returned.
- After the closing date and time, entries cannot be accepted, canceled, altered, or substituted except as provided for in Chapter 11, Section 6 of the Dog Show Rules.

Trial Site Information

- This will be a 1 ring trial.
- Course maps will be available either by email the day of the trial or posted copies.
- The club will be using Agility Gate – Course Maps will be available on Agility Gate.
- No vendors will be allowed.
- There are no RV Hook-ups

SITE INFORMATION: The show site will be available to exhibitors on Friday at 7:00 a.m. for setup. The building will be vacated nightly, and no dogs may be left overnight. The ring size is 78W X 103L feet. All classes will be held on a packed dirt surface in an enclosed arena.

DIRECTIONS TO TRIAL SITE:

The parking lot will not be open to exhibitors or the public until 7:00 AM every day. Please, do not arrive early or block the private drive.

From IH-10 or IH-35: Take Loop 410 South to Southcross/Sulphur Springs Road (Exit #37). Turn left onto Sulphur Springs Road (under the highway), travel 4 miles to Heritage Middle School. At the school, turn left onto a private drive. ADOC Event Center is ¼-mile down the private drive. This is a single vehicle-width lane, so be courteous to those vehicles exiting.

From IH-37: Take Loop 410 North to Southcross/Sulphur Springs Road (Exit #37). Turn right onto Sulphur Springs Road (under the highway), travel 4 miles to Heritage Middle School. At the school, turn left onto a private drive. ADOC Event Center is ¼-mile down the private drive. This is a single vehicle-width lane, so be courteous to those vehicles exiting.

From Loop 1604: Turn Westbound on FM 3432 (Sulphur Springs Road). Travel west approximately 4 miles to Gardner Road; the private drive for ADOC Event Center is on the right. This is a single vehicle-width lane, so be courteous to those vehicles exiting.

PAPER ENTRIES:

Make all checks payable in U.S. funds to: ADOC. All entries must be submitted on official AKC agility entry forms, one dog per entry form. Photocopies of front and back are accepted only if legible and official AKC size. Entries will not be accepted without signature, fees, and signature on agreement on back of entry form. Please waive "signature required" on all expedited entries. Send entries to Emily Forsyth, 11504 Forest Rd San Antonio, TX 78233. **Please specify ADOC on the envelope.**

ONLINE ENTRIES:

This trial is accepting online entries through LabTestedOnline.com (not through AKC). During the first 48 hours after opening, the initial limit of entries designated as either online or paper will be as follows. 125 runs online (50%), 125 runs paper (50%) each day. If either form of entry has not filled at the end of the 48-hour time, the club reserves the right to decrease or increase either one accordingly.

Wait-list Policy: The club is offering a waitlist to fill openings created by withdrawn entries after the trial's closing date/time. A maximum of 25 entries will be placed on the club's waitlist. All entries, including wait-listed entries, must be received by the Trial Secretary prior to the trial closing date as listed on the front of this premium. Any entries withdrawn that are received by 6:00 p.m. on September 30 will be replaced by a wait-listed entry if any are available. If a withdrawn entry is replaced by a wait-listed entry, a full refund will be issued for the withdrawn entry. Any wait-listed entry that does not move off the waitlist into the trial by 6:00 p.m., September 30 will be refunded.

AWARDS:

Placement Ribbons will be available to qualifying dogs for 1st through 4th place in each jump height in the Standard, Jumpers W/ Weaves and FAST Titling class. In the T2B class only the 1st place qualifying dog from each jump height will receive a placement ribbon. Qualifying ribbons will be awarded to all dogs receiving a qualifying score. Dogs must qualify to receive placement ribbons. New Title and MACH/PACH ribbons and MACH/PACH bars will also be awarded. Ribbons will not be self-serve at this trial. The trial secretary or a helper will give you your ribbon or sticker.

Awards:

Placement Ribbons will be available to qualifying dogs for 1st through 4th place in each jump height in the Standard, Jumpers W/ Weaves and FAST Titling class. In the T2B class only the 1st place qualifying dog from each jump height will receive a placement ribbon. Qualifying ribbons will be awarded to all dogs receiving a qualifying score. Dogs must qualify to receive placement ribbons. New Title and MACH/PACH ribbons and MACH/PACH bars will also be awarded. Ribbons will be self-serve at this trial.

Course Familiarization and Warm-ups:

Handlers in all classes are permitted to walk the course, without a dog, prior to the start of the class. A walk-through period will be held prior to each class. A warm-up area, consisting of one regulation agility jump per ring, shall be provided for all exhibitors.

Concessions:

There will not be a concession stand available on the trial site. Snacks and lunch will be provided for workers.

Dogs eligible to enter:

This trial is open to all dogs fifteen (15) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number. Approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breeds are eligible to participate. Dogs with a Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number must be spayed or neutered to compete. Wherever the word “dog” is used in these regulations it includes both sexes. Dogs should be physically sound. Dogs that are blind shall not be eligible, and neither are bitches in season, aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity, injury, or illness that may affect the dog’s physical or mental performance. No dog shall compete if it is taped or bandaged in any way or has anything attached to it for medical purposes. Refer to Chapter 2 of the Registration and Discipline Rules for the listing of registerable breeds that may participate. Puppies under four months of age are prohibited from the trial grounds.

All dogs **MUST** be always on a leash when on trial grounds except when in the designated warm-up area or competing on the course.

Move-ups:

Move-ups for the first day of the trial will be accepted in writing prior to 6:00 pm on September 30, 2024. Send email move-ups to nortsmom@goldens4me.net. Move-ups for the subsequent days of this trial will be accepted no later than 30 minutes after the completion of the trial on Friday and Saturday on the forms provided. Move-ups will not be accepted the morning of the trial. Per Chapter 1, Section 20, exhibitors may show up at the trial site and request a move up in writing to the trial secretary no later than the day preceding the event. Also, “A dog which has been entered in a Novice “A” class for which it is not eligible to be entered in due to class restrictions on the dog or the handler may be moved to the Novice “B” class under the following conditions: The request for the move must be in writing and presented to the superintendent or trial secretary at least 30 minutes prior to the start of each trial. The request must state the reason and justification for the move from a Novice “A” class to a Novice “B” class.”

Attention Volunteers!!!

ADOC appreciates everyone who helps make our trials successful by contributing their time. We will have sign-up sheet at the check-in table for volunteers. Fill out early to grab the spot you want. We will provide water and snacks for workers at a designated location.

Crating:

Crating will be either inside the arena or the portable next to the arena.

Notice to Exhibitors:

- Choke collars, pinch collars, prong collars, electric and dummy electric collars are prohibited on trial grounds.
- ADOC and ADOC Training and Event Center assume no responsibility for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors, handlers or to any of their dogs or property and further assume no responsibility for injury to children.
- Exhibitors are responsible for being at the ring gate when it is their turn to run. Judges need not wait for any dog holding up a class. ADOC, ADOC Training and Event Center, and the Trial Secretary have no obligation or responsibility for locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required.
- Exhibitors are responsible for picking up after their own dogs. A clearly marked exercise area will be located near the show barn.
- All dogs present must be on a leash or confined to crates when not being judged, except when in the designated warm-up area.
- Exhibitors should follow their veterinarians’ recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations.
- The safety of dogs is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all the obstacles safely.
- Entry fees will not be refunded if a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by action of the Trial Committee.

- It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the Trial Committee, be asked to leave the trial site. In that case, no refund of any fees paid will be made.
- No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, extreme weather, fire, an act of God, public emergency, an act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee.
- Exhibitors are responsible for complete, accurate, and legible information on their entry forms; illegible or incomplete entries cannot be entered in the show. **PLEASE PRINT OR TYPE CLEARLY.** IF THE ENTRY FORM IS PHOTOCOPIED OR FAXED, THE AGREEMENT ON THE BACK OF THE FORM MUST ALSO BE PHOTOCOPIED OR FAXED AND ATTACHED TO THE ENTRY WHEN IT IS MAILED OR FAXED. Entry forms cannot be accepted if they are not signed or specify any conditions for their acceptance.
- No refunds for duplicate entries. However, care will be taken to find duplicates before processing. Owners are responsible for errors in making out entry forms, and no entry fee will be refunded in the event of such errors.
- Checks that have been returned due to insufficient funds do not constitute a valid entry and will have a \$35.00 service charge attached.
- Bitches in season are not allowed to compete. ADOC will refund entry fees for bitches in season. The Trial Secretary must receive written notification from the owner the day before the trial starts by noon. Refunds will be mailed after the closing of the event.
- ADOC reserves the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog on account of aggression, disease, deformity, injury, or illness that may affect the dog's physical or mental performance. No one shall have any recourse or claim against ADOC or any official thereof. All exhibitors should obtain a copy of the Regulations for Agility Trials by downloading them from the American Kennel Club website at <http://www.akc.org/rules/>.

Entering a Mixture of Regular and Preferred Classes Within the Same Trial Weekend – Multiple Jump Heights Within the Same Trial Day

Exhibitors may enter a mixture of both Regular and Preferred classes on the same trial day and/or during a trial weekend. Any mixture of Regular and Preferred classes is allowed. Please note that if a dog qualifies in Regular Master Standard and Preferred Master JWW (or vice versa) on the same trial day, then NO Double Q shall be earned toward either the MACH or PACH title. The Double Q still requires that Standard Agility and Jumpers with Weaves be both Regular OR both Preferred on the same trial day.

Additionally, within the same Regular or Preferred classes, a dog may now be entered in multiple jump heights within the same trial day. For example, the same dog may now be entered in 20-inch Master STD/JWW while also entered in 24C-inch Premier STD/JWW on the same trial day.

A separate entry form must be submitted when the same dog is being entered in a mixture of Regular and Preferred and/or different jump heights within the same trial weekend thereby clearly indicating which class(es) and/or jump heights belong together for each trial day of the weekend.

Entering for Exhibition Only (FEO)

For Exhibition will be offered at this trial. **FEO is allowed in all classes offered.** FEO will be of value to new exhibitors or exhibitors that are having difficulty with a specific obstacle and/or ring environment. Competitors must enter the class they will run FEO. Participation in FEO is non-qualifying.

- FEO runs are treated as trial entries. The exhibitor must enter the class(es) prior to the closing date, pay class entry fee(s) and the Trial Secretary must record the entry in the Trial Catalog as part of the results for that class. FEO does not need to be noted on the entry form; the handler will declare the day of the show.
- Dogs may be entered in any jump height for FEO runs. If entered in an ineligible jump height, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show jump height changes are not allowed.
- Dogs may be entered in any level of the class (Novice, Open, Excellent, Master). If the dog is not eligible for the level entered, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show level changes are not allowed.
- The exhibitor must declare FEO in the ring prior to leading out. FEO may be declared earlier (ex. when checking in at the gate board).
- Toys are allowed in the ring.
 - Toys must be non-audible.
 - Toys may not leave the handler's hand.
 - Toys that roll freely cannot be used.
- Food/treats are not allowed in the ring.
- FEO should be utilized for the benefit of the dog and not as a punitive correction. Harsh verbal and /or physical corrections shall not be tolerated. Any determination of harshness by the judge shall be immediately whistled and the handler will be dismissed from the ring.
- A judge must monitor the entire run. Judges can stop a run at any time.

Fix and Go On (FNG)

FNG allows exhibitors to immediately reattempt an obstacle at any time while on course when the dog's performance of an obstacle is not to their expectation. This allows the dog to successfully complete the obstacle then finish the course or leave the ring on a positive note. Using FNG will result in a non-qualifying score.

Fix and Go On is not pre-entered; rather, it occurs during the run.

I certify that I am the actual owner of the dog, or that I am the duly authorized agent of the actual owner whose name I have entered. In consideration of the acceptance of this entry, I (we) agree to abide by the rules and regulations of The American Kennel Club in effect at the time of this event, and any additional rules and regulations appearing on the premium list of this event and entry form and any decision made in accord with them. I (we) agree that the club holding this event has the right to refuse this entry for a cause which the club shall deem sufficient. I (we) certify and represent that the dog entered is not a hazard to persons or other dogs. In consideration of the acceptance of this entry and of the holding of this event and of the opportunity to have the dog judged and to win prizes, ribbons, or trophies, I (we) agree to hold the AKC, the event-giving club, their members, directors, governors, officers, agents, superintendents or event secretary and the owner and/or lessor of the premises and any provider of services that are necessary to hold this event and any employees or volunteers of the aforementioned parties, and any AKC approved judge, judging at this event, harmless from any claim for loss or injury which may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly to any person or thing by the act of this dog while in or about the event premises or grounds or near any entrance thereto, and I (we) personally assume all responsibility and liability for any such claim; and I (we) further agree to hold the aforementioned parties harmless from any claim for loss, injury or damage to this dog. Additionally, I (we) hereby assume the sole responsibility for and agree to indemnify, defend and save the aforementioned parties harmless from any and all loss and expense (including legal fees) by reason of the liability imposed by law upon any of the aforementioned parties for damage because of bodily injuries, including death at any time resulting therefrom, sustained by any person or persons, including myself (ourselves), or on account of damage to property, arising out of or in consequence of my (our) participation in this event, however such, injuries, death or property damage may be caused, and whether or not the same may have been caused or may be alleged to have been caused by the negligence of the aforementioned parties or any of their employees, agents, or any other person. INSTRUCTIONS

Handlers may opt to enter in a higher height division for all Regular titling classes, but not in a division lower than their proper height division. Dogs entered in the Preferred classes must compete at the required jump height and may not compete in a jump height division higher or lower than their proper height division.

All dogs that have not been officially measured for an Agility Jump Height Card may still compete; however, they must be measured by a Judge of record, an Agility Field Representative, or a Volunteer Measuring Official, prior to running. If measured by the Judge of record, that measurement will be valid for this trial or back-to-back trials only. If a measurement is necessary, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog(s) measured prior to running.

Dogs listed in the AKC Canine Partners ProgramSM may be eligible to enter all-breed AKC agility trials at the club's option. These dogs should be listed as All American Dog and must include their AKC number on the entry form.

Junior Handlers should enter their Junior Handler Number on the front of this form. Should you not have your Junior Handler number, it may be obtained from the American Kennel Club (919) 233-9767. If the Junior Handler is not the owner of the dog identified on the face of this form, what is the relationship of the Junior Handler to the Owner
