Start Times

The grounds will open no earlier than 7:30am on each test day.

All dogs will be inspected no earlier than 8:00 am

The AM tests will begin no earlier than 9:00 am and continue until all runs are completed.

All tests will run concurrently, your dog will run both tests either in the AM time slot or the PM time slot, your choice.

Inspection will **immediately** follow check-in, at the area adjacent to the check-in desk. All dogs must be inspected (prior to each run) for fitness, lameness, or "in season" females, before they will be permitted to run.

Dogs and handlers will then wait in the paddock area for their turn to run.

Important Information

Fast CAT is an outdoor event and there is no shade at the test site. Please plan accordingly with respect to weather, shade/ shelter, food, and water.
A lunch break will be scheduled at the discretion of the Event Committee.

ALL DOGS RUN AT OWNER'S SOLE RISK

- All entries must be 12 months of age or older on the day of the test.
- Entries will not be accepted without fees, signatures, or the "Agreement" found on the *Official AKC Entry Form*.
- Bitches "in season" and lame dogs will be excused, and entry fees will be refunded.
- Mixed breeds must be spayed or neutered to be eligible to run. AKC registered dogs with breed disqualifications may be entered.
- Dogs that are overweight and/or out of condition may be at greater risk for injury and exhaustion. The Inspection Committee has the authority to disallow a dog's entry into the test, and in such instances, applicable entry fees will be refunded.
- **\$5.00 fee may be assessed for any loose dog on the field that is not competing in the course in progress.**
- Lures consist of white plastic bags.
- Exhibitors should follow their veterinarian's recommendation to assure their dogs are free of parasites, any communicable diseases and have appropriate vaccinations.
- The Hunt master is responsible for field safety and therefore the Hunt master is in complete charge of all dogs and handlers on the field. In service to this responsibility, the Hunt master has the authority to stop the lure in any potentially dangerous situation and signal the handler to retrieve a testing dog.
- PCSA reserves the right to remove any dog in distress in a parked vehicle or crate.
- Persons who exhibit conduct detrimental to the AKC, ADOC, or any dogs/other person(s) will be asked to leave the test site. In such cases, no refund of any entry fees will be made.
- No entry fees will be refunded if the event cannot be started or completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, extreme and/or dangerous weather conditions, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, strikes or any other cause beyond the control of the ADOC or its members and representatives.
- The event-hosting club, its agents, members, representatives, volunteers, etc., assume no liability or responsibility for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors, handlers or to any of their dogs or property, whether because of an accident or any other cause. The above-listed further assumes no responsibility for injury to children or spectators before, during, or after this event.

WHAT IS Fast CAT???

Fast CAT is a timed 100-yard dash for dogs. Dogs are held at the start line and the coursing lure is activated prompting the dog to follow, chasing it, to the finish line, and "catch area". The course is completely fenced, and dogs run individually. Dogs are timed when they complete the 100- yard dash.

Time is converted to Miles Per Hour (MPH), using the formula below, round- ed to the nearest hundredth of a mile:

Formula: $204.545 / \text{RUN TIME} = \text{MPH}$

Based on the height of the dog at its withers, a handicap is applied, and points are earned:

- a. 18" or greater = handicap is 1.0,
- b. 12" up to less than 18" = handicap is 1.5,
- c. Below 12" = handicap is 2.0

Points = MPH x HANDICAP = POINTS

ELIGIBILITY

Fast CAT events are open to all dogs at least 12 months of age that are individually registered with the AKC, recorded in the Foundation Stock Service (FSS) program, individually registered with a foreign or domestic registry organization whose pedigrees are acceptable for AKC registration, dogs granted a Purebred Alternative Listing(PAL) number, dogs with AKC Limited or Conditional Registration, or dogs enrolled in the AKC Canine Partners program. Dogs with breed disqualifications and monorchid/cryptorchid dogs are eligible to participate. Females in season may not enter. A dog may enter only once per event.

AKC RANKING

The *Fast Cat Top 20 Fastest Dogs* are listed by breed on the AKC website. Dogs will appear on this list when they have completed 3 Fast CAT runs. https://www.apps.akc.org/apps/fastcat_ranking/

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Coursing is an athletic activity that can tax a dog's physical strength. Dogs that are overweight and/or out of condition may be at a greater risk for injury and exhaustion. The inspection committee has the authority to disallow a dog's entry into a test, and in such instances, applicable entry fees will be refunded. A minimum wait time of 30 minutes is required between runs.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Please help keep the grounds clean by picking up after yourself and your dog. Dispose of "poop" bags in the trash containers provided at the site. Please keep your crating area, the test site and grounds clean so that we may continue holding events.

TIPS & INFORMATION FOR HANDLER

- The test field and 30-yard run-out is fully fenced.
- It is **strongly** recommended that, prior to running your dog, you have good "recall" control over your dog, as the dogs will be off leash. All other dogs must be leashed and under control.
- Handlers should wear comfortable clothing & shoes and be physically able to hold and release their dogs or be able to catch them.
- Dogs may run without a collar or wear any type of collar except choker collars, electronic training collars or head collar. Collars should be snug. Hanging tags pose a safety concern and it is suggested that tags be secured to the collar with tape. Dogs may run muzzled if desired. Clips or rubber bands may be used to keep long hair from falling across the dog's field of vision.
- Dogs will be brought to the start line on leash and released only upon a verbal signal ("Tallyho") from the Hunt master. Dogs may be released by hand, folded leash or using a traditional lure coursing slip lead.
- Handlers are not permitted to run with a dog during an official run but must remain either at the start or finish area of the course. Handlers are not to allow dogs to be enticed through the course with anything other than the lure during its official run.
- The handler should have someone familiar with the dog at the end of the course to retrieve the dog or have someone else release their dog at the start line. The handler is expected to promptly secure the dog and leave the course area, with the dog on leash.
- FAST Cat is a physically demanding sport, so please make sure your dog is in good shape. If you are not sure, make an appointment with a veterinarian to get an opinion.
- Handlers are advised to warm up their dogs prior to their run and walk them for several minutes afterwards.
- All dogs must be held on a leash or confined to a crate except when on the course running. Dogs must be on a leash when being exercised or warming up. Dogs must be removed from the test area immediately after their run.
- Any person, upon reasonable complaint, may be asked to leave the grounds of the test by the field committee and may be disciplined by the AKC. Children must be always under control of their parents or guardian(s).

Trial Site Directions and Parking

From IH-10 or IH-35: Take Loop 410 South to Southcross/Sulphur Springs Road (Exit #37). Turn left onto Sulphur Springs Road (under the highway), travel 4 miles to Heritage Middle School. At the school, turn left onto a private drive. Alamo Dog Event Center is 1/4-mile down the private drive. This is a single vehicle-width lane, so be courteous to those vehicles exiting.

From IH-37: Take Loop 410 North to Southcross/Sulphur Springs Road (Exit #37). Turn right onto Sulphur Springs Road (under the highway), travel 4 miles to Heritage Middle School. (Same as above)

From Loop 1604: Turn Westbound on FM 3432 (Sulphur Springs Road). Travel west approximately 5 miles to Gardner Road; the private drive for Alamo Dog Event Center is on the right. This is a single vehicle-width lane, so be courteous to those vehicles exiting.

Scheduling of Runs Concurrent Procedure

AKC is strongly recommending that all Fast CAT events be scheduled to avoid crowds at the event site because of the Covid- 19 virus. In response to that recommendation, we are going to schedule dogs to run both runs for each day either in the AM time block or the PM time block. In this scenario, if you have one dog entered and you are scheduled in the AM time block to do both runs, your two runs will be scheduled apart to give your dog sufficient time to rest. If you have multiple dogs entered, we will space your run times to allow switching dogs.

Any dog not present by the time the test ends will be considered absent.
